- 1. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
- 2. We add -es to make **dresses**, **wishes** and **dishes**.
- 3. The apostrophe goes in between the 'n' and 't'. It replaces the letter 'o' in the word 'cannot' to make **can't**.
- 4. Adjectives are describing words, so you may have found words like **energetic**, **happy**, **excited** or any other adjective that describes the dog.
- 5. A synonym is a word which means the same or is similar to another word. Examples of synonyms for the word **happy** could be **joyful**, **cheerful** and **gleeful**.
- 6. A conjunction is a word used to connect two clauses together, in this case the sentence would be: You have a banana in your bag **if** you have time to eat a snack.
- 7. Your answer should think about why you like the book better than other books you have read.

- 9. Remember to finish your sentence with a question mark. For example: Where did Mr. Scooby put all of the snacks?
- 10. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
- 11. Your drawing should include as much detail as possible and look how you imagined it when you read the story!
- 12. A verb is a doing word. The verb in this sentence is ran.
- 13. Bobby's shoes are super shiny.
- 14. There were two mistakes in this sentence. First an apostrophe for possession was missing in **Bobby's**. Secondly the word **are** was spelt incorrectly.
- 15. A conjunction is a word used to connect two clauses together, in this case the sentence would be: I got wet **when** it was raining yesterday.
- 16. Your sentence should use an exclamation mark the ! symbol. For example: That is the biggest chocolate cake I have ever seen!
- 17. Commas can be used to separate items in a list. In this case the sentence should be: Lisa takes her expensive, shiny, gold saxophone out of its case.

- 20. The five vowels in the alphabet are: A, E, I, O, U.
- 21. Read loudly and confidently! Remember to spell out words phonetically if you get stuck.
