Calendar Answers

1. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
2. The answer is: **big, bigger, biggest.**
3. Your sentence should unscramble to make a question, the answer is: **How many children came to the party?**
4. A full stop looks like this → . Full stops are used at the end of sentences to mark the sentence has ended.
5. The answer is: **I'm** inside so I **don't** need to wear a coat! Two contracted words need to be added to this sentence. Originally the word **I'm** would be 'I am' and the word **don't** is 'do not'.
6. Think about what characteristics this character has that makes them evil. Is it the way they speak? The way they treat other characters? The way they make other characters feel?
7. The capital letters should look like this: **Q, W, T, Y, P.**
8. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
9. Adjectives are describing words. For example, my favourite colour is blue, some adjectives that describe the colour blue are: calm, peaceful, tranquil, secure and soft.
- 10/11. Look back in your reading book at the description of the landscape to help you create your map. Think about including any important buildings or monuments. Be creative, use bright colours and label the different areas on the map!
12. An exclamation mark can be used to show shock, excitement or disbelief. They can also be used to indicate someone is shouting. For example: **The Olympic size swimming pool was absolutely enormous!**
13. The words that should be circled are: **Friday, Google** and **Amy**. All of these words are written with a capital letter as they are proper nouns.





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14. The correct sentence should read: **Tommy and Melanie drove their car to the bank.** Both Tommy and Melanie are proper nouns and names of people so they need to start with a capital letter. The wrong 'there' was used, it should be corrected to 'their'. Finally the word 'bank' is a common noun so it doesn't need to start with a capital letter.
15. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
16. A suffix goes at the end of a root word. Some possible answers you could have had are: **kinder, kindest, drier, driest, later and latest.** All of these adjectives can now be used for comparison.
17. Read loudly and confidently! Remember, if you get stuck try to spell out words phonetically.
18. A verb is a doing word. An adverb adds detail to a verb. Examples of adverbs are: **slowly, quickly, beautifully, kindly, helpfully, mostly.**
- 19/20. The proper noun is **Professor Proton** as this is the name of a specific person. The common noun is **jar of marbles** as this is talking about a general thing/item.
21. The two plural words which should be circled are: **authors** and **bedrooms.**
22. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
- 23/24. Remember to use lots of descriptive words to describe your favourite food. This alien from Mars will have never heard about your favourite food so be as descriptive as you can! Think about the five senses (sight, touch, smell, sound and most importantly, taste) to help you describe the food.
25. You should have used all three words, used capital letters and punctuation appropriately. For example: I took my teddy **bear bowling** with me, he watched as I threw the shiny **ball.**
26. All the words that should be circled are: **cear** and **snear.**





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27. Capital letters should be used at the start of every new sentence. They should also be used at the start of proper nouns, these are the names of specific people, places or things.
28. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
29. The answer is: **Eva's hair was very long.** An apostrophe for possession indicates ownership, in this case the hair belonging to Eva is Eva's hair.
30. Remember to include a question mark at the end of your sentence.
31. Adjectives are describing words and verbs are doing words. Try to identify three of each in your reading book!
