



- 1. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
- **2.** Remember to end your sentence with an exclamation mark.
- **3.** Common nouns refer to general, non-specific people, places, things or ideas. The common nouns in this sentence are: **cat, light and moon**.
- 4. Adjectives are describing words. You could have used adjectives like: delicious, scrumptious, sweet, yummy.
- **5/6.** Your treasure map could include landmarks or important landscapes from the last book you read! Be as creative as you can with this task.
 - 7. The answer is: I ate Tina's lunch by accident!
 - 8. In a dictionary.
 - **9.** Joe likes to sit behind the driver's side in the car. An apostrophe for possession should be added to the word 'driver's'.
 - **10.** The answer is: **The apple was bright green.**
 - 11. A prefix goes in front of a word to change its meaning. In this case the words would be changed to **untidy and unfair**. It makes the words mean the opposite to the original root word.
 - 12. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
 - 13. A verb is a doing word. The word underlined should be **reading**.
 - 14. Try to use bullet points and short sentences to create a short, clear and concise summary.
 - 15. You could use the 5 W's (**who, what, when, where, why**) to help you think of a question if you are stuck. For example: What inspired you to write this book? You could ask a question about specific characters or plot points.







- 16. Make sure there is a question mark at the end of your sentence. For example: How many apples are on that tree?
- 17. The words that should be circled and are not real are: junny, kunny and zunny.
- 18. The five vowels are: A, E, I, O, U.
- **19/20.** Be as creative as you can. You can sing your song to an audience!
 - 21. All of these words are proper nouns. They are the names of specific people, places or things and they all start with a capital letter.
 - 22. The apostrophe goes in between the 'n' and 't'. It replaces the 'o' in the words 'did not' to create the word **didn't**.
 - **23.** Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
 - 24. A suffix goes at the end of a root word. The answers are: running, hopping and skipping.
 - **25.** A conjunction is a word used to connect clauses or sentences, like the words **and**, **but**, **if**. The answer to this question is: Megan wanted to play football outside **but** it was raining.
 - **26.** The answers are: **foxes, beaches and wishes**. To make each of these words plural you add -es.
- **27/28.** Be as creative as you can with this question! Think about the things you would be able to see, touch, smell and hear in an underwater world.
 - **29.** The answer is: beach, fish, seaweed, waves.
