1. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
2. An exclamation mark can be used to indicate someone is shouting or speaking loudly. The exclamation mark goes at the end of the sentence so the answer is: Come over here Buddy!
3. The capital letters should be: A, B, C, D, E.
4. An adjective is a describing word, your sentence should include three describing words. For example: I was eating a **freezing cold, blue** ice cream.
5. The answer is: buckets, spades and brushes.
- 6/7. The words unscrambled are: pizza, strawberry, chicken and pancake.
8. The issue is the word 'was' is in the wrong tense. The corrected sentence should read: We **were** painting the fence.
9. The three main parts of a story are the **beginning, middle and end**.
10. It is **Amy's** car. The **cat's** whiskers are long. **Robert's** shoes are dirty.
11. A conjunction is a word used to connect two simple sentences. For example **but, if, and**.
12. I **saw** a rainbow.
13. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
14. A full stop should be used at the end of a sentence. Your sentence should be about your favourite sport and end in a full stop. For example: I **first started playing tennis after watching Wimbledon**.
15. The answers are: **slept, smelt** and **ate**.
16. The answers are: **buzzing, hunting** and **jumping**.





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17. A proper noun is the name of a specific person, place or thing. In this case the word that should be underlined is **Altron**.
18. You should have circled: **jink, dink and vink**.
19. You need to use an apostrophe to make these words contractions. The answers are: **I'm, I've and I'll**.
- 20/21. You should have a list of any words, people or things that make you happy! For example: my family, summer time, plants, travelling and baking.
22. There are seven days of the week. They are spelt: **Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday**.
23. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
24. Don't forget to use a question mark at the end of your sentence! Your question could be about anything. For example: Is it forecasted to rain today?
25. Your summary should be at least a paragraph long. You could have followed a beginning, middle, end structure to make the summary very clear.
- 26/27. Your sentence should be based on how the character is described in your book. You can use the five W's (**who, where, what, when, why**) to create questions you would like to ask your favourite book character.
28. The correct spelling of these words are: **was, stopped and cried**.
29. An adjective is a describing word. For example, five adjectives to describe a lion are **fierce, brave, majestic, vicious and scary**.
30. A prefix goes in front of a root word to change its meaning. The answers are: **unhelpful, unkind and unhappy**.
31. A common noun refers to general objects, people or places. For example: **mother, father, lion, tiger, book, pencil**.
