1. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
2. The answers are: **bushes, glasses, watches**. The rule is you add -es to make these words plural
3. Remember to end your sentence with a question mark. For example:
How do you tell the time?
4. Make a prediction based on what has already happened in your reading book. Your explanation could be based on events that you have already read about.
5. Adjectives are describing words. You could have written a sentence like this: The **green** racing car was **small** but **rapid**.
6. The answer is: The pig is in the mud.
- 7/8. Try and draw the character exactly as you imagine them in your head. Remember to refer back to the character's description in your reading book to help you.
9. An apostrophe for possession needs to be added to this sentence. The answer is: I am going to **Janice's** house tonight.
10. The prefix re- changes these words to: **reappear, redo and repaint**.
11. Adjectives are describing words. Make sure all the words you have picked are adjectives, not nouns or verbs.
12. If you are not sure what these adjectives mean, use a dictionary to look up their definition! Every time you use one of the words, you can tick it off your list.
13. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
14. The plural for computer is **computers**, you add an 's' to make it a plural. The plural of country is **countries**, you remove the 'y' and replace it with 'ies' to make it a plural.





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15. The correct answer is: Her name is Pearl and she's from Paris. All sentences need to start with a capital letter. All proper nouns, the name of a specific person, place or thing, need to start with a capital letter. So the name 'Pearl' and the place 'Paris' need to start with capital letters.
16. Read confidently and loudly! If you get stuck on a word, try to spell it out phonetically.
17. The apostrophe goes in between the letters 'n' and 't' to make the word **doesn't**. This is because the apostrophe replaces the 'o' in the phrase 'does not' to make the shorter word, **doesn't**.
18. The answers are: **smiled, flipped and hoped**. All of these words are now in the past tense.
- 19/20. You should give your own opinion about what makes a character heroic. For example it could be their strength, bravery, kindness or willingness to help others. Adjectives are describing words, to describe your heroic character you could have used words such as: powerful, strong, muscular, friendly or helpful.
21. The words that are not real and should be circled are: **joot** and **fof**.
22. Remember to use a capital letter at the start of your sentence and a full stop or exclamation mark at the end. For example: The shiny **red** bowling **ball** was very **heavy** when I picked it up!
23. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
24. Verbs are doing words. For example: **run, kick, carry, throw, fall, whisper, call, sniff, touch**.
25. The plural for sheep is **sheep**, this word doesn't change and is an exception to the general plural rule. The plural for goose is **geese**, this is another special exception to the general plural rule.





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- 26/27.** Your character could be based on anything you want! It could be yourself as a character, one of your friends, a pet or something completely made up. When you label your extra character make sure you think about their personality, any powers they have and how they interact with other existing characters in the reading book.
- 28.** A verb is a doing word, so the word **running** should be underlined. The answer should look like this: The dog was **running** very quickly!
- 29.** A proper noun is the name of a specific person, place or thing. Proper nouns always start with a capital letter.
- 30.** A conjunction is a word used to connect two clauses together, for example **and**, **but**, **if**. The answer is Kiera wore a coat to school **but** it was very hot outside.
- 31.** The words **Harry** and **Spain** need capital letters as they are proper nouns and proper nouns always start with a capital letter.
