



- 1. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
- 2. Adjectives are describing words. Examples of adjectives that are associated with the colour blue are: calm, peaceful, tranquil, magical, sad, cold.
- 3. Remember to end your sentence with a question mark. For example: Who is the richest woman in the world?
- 4. A main clause is a part of a sentence that makes sense by itself. The answer is: I like going to the cinema.
- 5. The answer is: I sat in a cafe while it rained. Both verbs, 'sitting' and 'raining' changed to make this sentence in the past tense.
- 6/7. You can use books or the internet to help you find a poem about spring! Remember to read loudly and confidently. If you get stuck on a word, try to spell it out phonetically.
 - 8. Verbs are doing words. Here are some examples of words you could have used to fill in the gap in the sentence: ran, walked, sprinted, skipped, trotted, danced.
 - 9. Remember to end your sentence with an exclamation mark. The tone of your sentence should be positive and upbeat. For example: I passed my violin exam with a distinction!
 - 10. A prefix goes in front of the root word. The common prefix that links all of these words together is un-. This makes the words unlock, untrue and unsafe.
 - 11. A suffix goes at the end of a root word. The words circled should be grateful, quickly and delightful. The suffixes are -ful, -ly and -ful.
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- 13/14. Your poem could be any form it could rhyme, be acrostic or a shape poem. You could go outside or look at images of spring and the changing seasons in books or online to help you write your poem.
 - 15. You could create a drawing, painting or create a piece of artwork with tissue paper. Re-read your poem to get inspiration for your artwork.
 - 16. The answer is **great**. The sentence should read: We had a **great** time at the fair.
 - 17. An adverb adds detail to a verb, they often end in the suffix -ly. Here are some examples of adverbs you could have used to fill in the gap in the sentence: quickly, slowly, rapidly, swiftly, briskly, steadily, leisurely.
 - 18. A personal pronoun is a short word that is used as a substitute for someone's name. For example: I, you, he, she, it, we, they, me, him, her. us.
 - 19. Make this prediction based on what you have already read, what you know about all of the characters and their intentions. Carry on reading to see if your prediction was correct!
 - 20. Book genres are 'types' of books, like themes or groups. Examples of genres include: fantasy, science fiction, mystery, horror, thriller, humour, romance, crime, adventure.
 - 21. Common nouns are the general name for non-specific people, places or things. The words that should be circled are **deer**, **fawn**, **water and lake**.
 - **22.** Proper nouns are the names of specific people, places or things. The rule is they should always start with a capital letter.
 - **23.** The answer is: "My butterfly collection is bigger than yours!" shouted Stan.







- 24. Check them carefully or ask a grown-up to check with you!
- 25. You can include key landmarks from your reading book using the description of the setting. Refer back to the description of different settings in your reading book to help you.
- 26/27. Refer back to the description of your favourite character in your reading book to help you. Use adjectives to describe their features and characteristics, try to make the annotations as detailed as possible!
 - 28. A conjunction is a word used to connect two clauses together, for example: and, but, if. The answer is: I would go but it's too far away!
 - 29. A synonym is a word that means the same as another word. Examples of synonyms for the word calm are: tranquil, peaceful, serene, undisturbed, restful, halcyon.
 - **30.** The answer is **lives**. The sentence should read: My friend **lives** in Japan.
 - 31. Your ending could change the plot entirely, it could change the personality of certain characters or even change who the main character is. It is important the ending you create is different from the original ending of the story. Be as creative as you can!
